COVID-19 Updates

Alert: SBA Withdraws PPP Loan Necessity Questionnaire

In an ACCNJ Alert distributed on July 12, we informed members the Small Business Administration (SBA) has officially withdrawn the use of its “Loan Necessity Questionnaire.” The notice came in the form of a July lender update that stated SBA was withdrawing the use of the form “effective immediately.” Loan Necessity Questionnaires that SBA previously requested are no longer required to be submitted as part of the forgiveness process. Members who were previously asked to complete the questionnaire should contact their lender regarding SBA’s withdrawal of the requirement.
